Easter Greetings from the SEPA Synodical Board of the Women of the ELCA,

We have a really special event coming in June – it's our Biennial Synodical Convention. This year we're meeting at Messiah Lutheran Church in Downingtown, Chester Conference, for a program entitled "Marys and Marthas – a celebration of the diversity of our spiritual gifts". Our theme verse is from 1 Corinthians 12:4-6. Joining us from the Churchwide Board will be our newly elected Executive Board Secretary, Dr. Freddie Jordan. She'll bring us the latest news from our churchwide board, and be available for any questions you might have about Women of the ELCA.

Our keynote will be a shared presentation by representatives of Lutheran World Relief(LWR) and inFaith. Most of us are familiar with the work LWR does, but we'll learn about new programs and initiatives, and sample some LWR-provided coffee. InFaith is an organization that has recently partnered with WELCA on presentations about stewardship at the synodical level and at the 2017 Triennial. Their new project with WELCA is an effort to raise more than \$5M for Katie's Fund over the next 2 years. The joint keynote message should get you thinking about the array of talents, experiences and interests of the women of your church. How can we use these gifts to promote the values of our Purpose Statement?

I think we can all agree that Women of the ELCA is a wonderful organization, and we'd like more women to participate. We should all feel invigorated about the work of this organization. Start looking around at your church for women who might like to start a Café group, or a bible study, or some other type of meeting that's different from your current circle offering. Consider providing childcare or a meal so working women and moms can participate more easily. Contact a board member to help plan a special event. We're here to support you.

We encourage you to attend conference and synodical events whenever possible. They provide a great way to meet like-minded women and learn more about WELCA's programs. We also urge you to consider running for a seat on the synodical board. Our purpose is to act as a conduit between the congregational units and the churchwide board and staff by sharing information and resources.

We look forward to seeing you at upcoming events. Thank you for your continued support of this amazing organization!

PERSONAL CARE KITS

SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- Be sure to shop for light- or medium-weight towels, which are easier for Kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffier towels we may prefer to use.
- Bath towels vary in size. The 52" X 27" size listed in the guidelines is the maximum size. 20" x 40" is a good guideline for a minimum size.
- Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- All items should be new and in good condition.
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT

ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
ONE adult-size toothbrush in it's original packaging*
ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging
ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

* Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

HOW TO PACK YOUR PROJECT PROMISE KITS

- Fold the towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll so nothing falls out, and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.
- Pack completed Kits, like items together, in boxes.
 Label contents in LARGE, BLOCK LETTERS on the outside of the boxes.
- Use strong cartons secured with packing tape, not to exceed 40 pounds.
- Do not use plastic or paper bags to pack donations.
- Include the name and address of your group or congregation on each box and label the contents



Ingathering and Lutheran World Relief

2017 was a wonderful year for the synod's Ingathering for Lutheran World Relief. The Synodical Board of the Women of the ELCA was entrusted with coordinating the collection of quilts, blankets, and kits at last year's Synod Assembly, and it was a great success. Over 500 quilts were collected, in addition to hundreds of kits and blankets. We are a very generous synod!

However, this year the synod will elect a new bishop, and it was decided that the Ingathering

would take more resources than would be available. As a result, the synodical InGathering event will take place **June 2 at Messiah Lutheran Church**, **Downingtown**, the morning of the Women of the ELCA Convention.

Donations of quilts and kits will be loaded on a truck from 8:00 a.m. until 9:15 a.m. when worship begins. Everyone making a donation that morning is invited to stay for worship, and to participate with the assembly as they bless and send

the donations out into the world.

In order to make the LWR Ingathering a success, please consider:

- Instructions for LWR quilts and kits are available here: https://lwr.org/get-involved
- A contribution of \$50 per congregation donating quilts and kits is suggested to cover the shared cost of trucking the donations to the LWR warehouse in Maryland. It is helpful to have these funds in advance. Checks should be written to Women of the ELCA, note *Ingathering 2017* and mailed to Elaine Keller, WELCA Synodical Board Treasurer.
- Volunteers will be needed on Saturday, June 2 to collect, count and organize donations, and pack the truck. If you are interested in volunteering, or have any questions or concerns about the Ingathering, please contact Joy Grace, Synodical Board President, at 484-432-8087.

- The Region 7 Women of the ELCA Triennial Spiritual Gathering, "All that we have ... All that we are ... All that we hope to be ... We Are An Offering" is based on 1 Peter 4: 10-11. The event will be held April 27-29, 2018 at Holy Family Passionist Retreat Center.
- ▶ Holy Family Passionist Retreat Center is located on 48 picturesque and tranquil wooded acres at 303 Tunxis Road, West Hartford, CT, complete with an outdoor labyrinth, walking rails, stations of the cross, lovely gardens, and ample parking. The main dining room is lovely with a superb chef on staff to provide delicious and well-balanced meals. A bookstore is available onsite. The facility is easily accessible from Interstate 84, or a 15 minute trip from Union Station in Hartford, and a 30 minute drive from Bradley International Airport. - **▼ REGISTRATION** for the event begins at 3:00pm on Friday, April 27th with dinner being served at 5:00pm. The gathering will formally open at 6:15pm in the main conference room on the main floor. We will enjoy an interactive game of WELCA Bingo and a fun class on "Sex and Flowers," led by our own Professor Alice Carlson. (Please bring a container of any shape for the floral arrangement you will make to take home during this activity.)
- Throughout the weekend we will have time for women to tie fleece blankets for Lutheran World Relief. Please bring scissors appropriate for cutting fleece.
- There will be opportunity for both monetary offerings and in-kind gifts. Personal monetary offerings and those from your congregation will be received at the festive closing Eucharist on Sunday morning. One-half of these offerings will go to the Churchwide expression of Women of the ELCA. The other half will go to Lutheran Disaster Response.
- In-kind gifts will be collected for the Prudence Crandall Center, a domestic violence shelter and organization in New Britain, CT. You are invited to bring new bath towels and facecloths as well as new socks and underwear in any size from infant/toddler to adult (men and women). A representative from Prudence Crandall Center will be with us on Sunday morning to accept the gifts and to tell a bit about their organization. We will also be collecting new bath-size bars of soap (4-5 oz.) for Lutheran World Relief. (The soap will be taken along with the fleece blankets to upstate NY for pick-up by a truck which will take them to the LWR warehouse at no charge!)
- On Saturday night we will have a Talent Show in the main conference room! So, get your act together, Ladies! Showcase your talent! Please bring any props/instruments, etc. you will need. A podium, microphone and piano will be available. Solo or group acts welcome!
- ◆ Another opportunity that is available to you on Saturday evening but unrelated to our event, is an Easter concert, "The Joy of Easter," at Holy Family, April 28th at 7:30pm. Tickets are available by reservation through the Retreat Center. 
It's never too late to start planning ahead for the next Triennial. The Women of the ELCA will be meeting in July of 2020 for another incredible and unforgettable event!
