### **President's Message**

Greetings to all Women in the Southeastern PA Synod.

We are excited to offer a women's retreat, 'Gather, rest, and renew' on Saturday, October 14 from 9AM – 4PM. (see invitation on page 2 & 3) We were able to do this with the assistance of a \$1,000 grant money from Katie's Fund (see page 9), offered to all SWO's (synodical women's organization) to support programs, resources, and opportunities in one or more of these categories: leadership development, global connections, living theology. The money must be used to complete a program by December 31, 2023. Our board decided to use it for a SWO women's retreat.

We were blessed to hold our SE PA Synodical Women's Organization Convention on June 3, 2023, at Augustus Lutheran Church Trappe, PA. We were in person this year and had 24 attendees. Our offering was split with \$225.00 to churchwide Women of the ELCA and \$225.00 to Augustus congregational unit of Women of the ELCA to be used to support their ELCA missionaries working with sick children in Tanzania. Our theme was 'Celebrating what makes our SE PA women so unique'. Bible verse, 'Shout to the Lord, all the earth. Serve the Lord with joy; come before him with singing. The Lord is good. His love is forever, and his faithfulness continues through all generations.' Psalm 100: 1-2, 5. We were uplifted to hear about the how Gemma services help children, the work in Africa by the ELCA missionaries supported by Augustus Lutheran Church, and the history and take a tour of 'The Old Trappe Church' designed by Henry Melchoir Muhlenberg. We commissioned our Triennial voting members, Pastor Gwendolyn King, Sue Swope, Jennifer Wentworth, Joan Seader, and Linda Garcia. **NOTE**: due to a new teaching job Jennifer Wentworth is unable to attend the Triennial this year so Joy Grace our alternate will be our 5<sup>th</sup> voting member.

This past 12 months we sent the following money to churchwide 6/2022 – 6/2023

• \$2315.50, plus \$200 designated to Katie's Fund We also received a \$1,000 memorial gift from estate of Betsy Anderson which the board designated to help women go to the Triennial. We received offerings from nine congregational units since June 2022.

We want to focus on helping the congregational units as they continue to gather in person. We also want to help conferences rebuild by planning events for women to attend.



# Just Love 2023 12th Triennial Convention and Gathering

The 2023 12<sup>th</sup> Triennial Convention of the Women of the ELCA is meeting from September 19-21 in Phoenix, Arizonia. Our elected voting members, Pastor Gwen King, Joan Seader, Sue Swope and Joy Grace, and President Linda Garcia will be representing us. They will deal with the business of WELCA, electing Board members, and officers, choosing what ministries and projects to emphasize in the coming three years, and acting on any business or recommendations submitted by the Synod organizations of WELCA.

Following the Convention is the Triennial Gathering of the Women of the ELCA which begins on the evening of September 21<sup>st</sup> with opening worship and the first plenary.



The theme for the Gathering is Just Love. Friday and Saturday Morning Plenary sessions will feature Bible study, featured speakers, music and devotions. Friday and Saturday afternoons there will be opportunities to attend learning sessions. Our speakers include Krish O'Mara Vignarajah; Rev. Angela T. !Khabeb; and Jacqueline Bussie. Our preachers are Rev. Tiffany Chaney and Rev Irma Bañales. Our worship leaders are Kimberly Knowle-Zeller and Rev. Deborah K. Hutterer. Dr. Kelly

Sherman-Conroy is our Bible study leader. There are also workshop leaders who will presenting learning opportunities on Friday and Saturday afternoons.

Throughout the gathering there will be vendors and service opportunities available in the Exhibit Hall.

We are also asked to bring In Kind gifts to share with four local service agencies in the Phoenix area. They have requested the following:

- Gift Cards **NOTE**: We will only be taking the gift cards to Phoenix with us. (minimum value \$10; \$25 is most desirable) these may be purchased from the following national retailers: Target, Walmart, Visa, Mastercard, Home Depot, Lowe's, Sam's Club, and Costco. Also local grocery stores
- Hygiene Items Family size— ethnic hair products, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, bar soap, deodorant, razors, and body lotion, for women, children, teens and men. Also needed are hand soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, feminine hygiene items (tampons and pads). Diapers (all sizes, sizes 4,5,6 always needed) and baby wipes any size packages.
- Clothing items socks and underwear (for women, men, teens; all sizes), sports bras (all sizes). Children's clothes up to 12 years old for girls and boys.
- Household items Twin and queen sheet sets, mattress pads for twin and queen beds, blankets, twin and queen size comforters, towel sets (bath, hand, washcloth), laundry baskets. Laundry soap, dish soap, hand soap. Toilet paper, paper towels, kitchen and bathroom disinfectant spray, sponges. Cleaning supplies Multipurpose cleaner, glass cleaner, bathroom.

#### **SEPa Women of the ELCA**

#### June 2023 Gathering

The theme of our 2023 Gathering was *Celebrate*. We celebrated the history of our Lutheran heritage and history. We met at Augustus Lutheran Church, the oldest actively used Lutheran Church building in America. Linda Garcia opened our program by sharing some of the history of WELCA and what ministry we have done in the past and are doing now on all levels – from our individual units, to our Synod, to Churchwide.

One of the organizations started by concerned women was the establishment of the first Lutheran orphanage in the Delaware Valley. Elizabeth Schaeffer founded the Germantown Orphans' Home in 1859. Over the years this has changed to the Silver Springs Martin Luther School which is now part of Gemma services. The school serves students who need emotional support; it is a residential school, but also has day students. Our speaker, Amanda Bryant shared the story of the school and how it is working to help its students be able to cope in our troubling world.

Our third speaker was Jennifer Wentworth who shared the history of the original Augustus Lutheran Church (a.k.a. The Old Trappe Church - the oldest unaltered Lutheran Church in America) which was designed by Henry Melchior Muhlenberg. The church was constructed in 1743 and consecrated in 1745. It was designated as a national historic landmark in 1967. We had the chance before entering the church to see the tombs of Henry Muhlenberg and his wife Anna Maria. We also saw the gravesite of his son Peter Muhlenberg who was a General under George Washington during the Revolutionary War and some other members of his family. The pews on the lower level were constructed between 1743 and 1745 by local carpenters. These pews were rented by families as a source of income for the Church; they had doors on the end of the pew. Since there was no heat in the building at that time, having a door on the pew to keep the draft out during the winter months would make you feel warmer. Those who didn't rent a pew could sit in the balcony along with unconfirmed children over the age of 7, slaves and indentured servants. The choir loft was added in 1752 along with an organ which significantly enhanced the typical German Lutheran service. A new and bigger church (a.k.a. The Brick Church) was

built and consecrated in 1852, but the Old Church continued in use for at least one service each year. In 1814, the Old Church did get a cast iron stove for heat. This stove was removed around 1860.

The Old Church is still used during the summer for the early Sunday morning services. It is also used for a special candle light service on Christmas Eve. Our voting members to the 12<sup>th</sup> Triennial were commissioned. Our offering of \$450.00 was split between Churchwide and Augustus Lutheran church to support their ELCA missionaries in Tanzania... Our Inkind offering donated to Gemma services was over 400 items of girls and boys socks and girls and boys underwear.
