It's Ancient, Ya'll





#### WAL THROUGH — THE DIDACHE XVIII. Set aside a Tithe for the Lord



EVERY TRUE PROPHET THAT WILLS TO ABIDE AMONG YOU IS WORTHY OF HIS SUPPORT. SO ALSO A TRUE TEACHER IS HIMSELF WORTHY, AS THE WORKMAN, OF HIS SUPPORT. EVERY FIRST-FRUIT, THEREFORE, OF THE PRODUCTS OF WINE-PRESS AND

THRESHING-FLOOR, OF OXEN AND OF SHEEP, YOU SHALL TAKE AND GIVE TO THE PROPHETS, FOR THEY ARE YOUR HIGH PRIESTS. BUT IF YOU HAVE NOT A PROPHET, GIVE IT TO THE POOR. IF YOU MAKE A BATCH OF DOUGH, TAKE THE FIRST-FRUIT AND GIVE ACCORDING TO THE COMMANDMENT. SO ALSO WHEN YOU OPEN A JAR OF WINE OR OF OIL, TAKE THE FIRST-FRUIT AND GIVE IT TO THE PROPHETS; AND OF MONEY (SILVER) AND CLOTHING AND EVERY POSSESSION, TAKE THE FIRST-FRUIT, AS IT MAY SEEM GOOD TO YOU, AND GIVE ACCORDING TO THE COMMANDMENT.

#### Anonymous Church Teaching, Prior to 100 AD



- Up to the 11<sup>th</sup> Century, the Offering was closely connected with the sacrament of the Eucharist-a gift of what was at hand
- In the Middle Ages this idea became distorted some and associated with appeasing God and a kind of "balancing of the sin-ledger."
- The Reformation sought to reclaim the idea of the Offering as a response to God's grace, not a response to God's anger.
- The Offering is an essential part of the Christian life.



- Uniquely American?
- The early missionaries to the States in our tradition had to wrestle with the fact that this new nation would not sponsor state religion
- Sponsorship still happens in countries with a historic state church
- Offerings came to support the church more-so than support the mission of the church...we have to wrestle with the reality and justice-issues related to this fact.

### The Offering is a Matter of Stewardship





*oikonomos* = Steward or manager "(Practicing stewardship) is as spiritual as giving a sermon, entering a time of prayer, visiting the sick, or feeding the hungry! (Stewardship) is always a call to conversion"


Stewardship is Generosity Mindfully Practiced and the Offering Must be Mindfully Practiced

- We need a new lens


