REPORT OF THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE SOUTHEASTERN PENNSYLVANIA SYNOD, ELCA SYNOD ASSEMBLY 2025

- 1. Nominations from the floor shall be made at the time of the first report of the Nominating Committee during the first business session of the Synod Assembly for all positions to be elected at this assembly.
- 2. The 2019 Churchwide Assembly changed the definition of "Clergy" to include both Ministers of Word and Sacrament (pastors) and Ministers of Word and Service (deacons). Therefore, Minsters of Word and Service (deacons) are now eligible to be nominated for Ticket 1. Deacons are no longer eligible for lay positions.
- 3. A reminder that a person making a nomination from the floor must immediately present to the Assembly office a copy of the nominee's biographical information, and a picture of the nominee. This nomination form may be completed on-line and sent as an email attachment to the registrar, Ms. Cynta Outterbridge, at coutterbridge@sepa.org. The form can be found on the synod's website, ministrylink.org.

This year we will be electing a Vice President of the Synod, as well as people to serve on Synod Council. The Vice President of the synod is one of the lay voting members of the Churchwide Assembly. Whoever is elected as our vice president will be attending the Churchwide Assembly as a voting member from this synod.

From the Constitution, By-laws, and Continuing Resolutions of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod:

Vice President S8.20.

The vice president shall be elected by the Synod Assembly; the vice president shall be a layperson. The vice president shall be a voting member of a congregation of this synod. The vice president shall not receive a salary for the performance of the duties of the office.

S8.21.01. The vice president may serve no more than three terms consecutively.

The vice president shall chair the Synod Council.

S8.22.01. The vice president shall be an ex officio voting member from the Synod to the Churchwide Assembly. In the event that the vice-president is unable to attend the Churchwide Assembly an additional nominee for the appropriate lay panel shall be made by the Nominating Committee.


